1	<p>We refer to drawing 2H-C5-020_Rev T1 (Matlabas River Crossing) and to the detail shown on the drawing.</p> <p>However, the payment items 2.H1.6.382 to 392, which cover the crossing at Ch 41.98 on the BPR to Offtake C section of the gravity main, do not reflect that shown on the drawing.</p> <p>Could you please clarify.</p>	<p>The attached Drawing No. 2H-C5-020_Rev T2 should be used and will replace Drawing.No. 2H-C5-020_Rev T1 previously issued. Addendum 4 will be issued to effect this change.</p> <p>The Matlabas River crossing is catered for in the BOQ issued to Tenderers, and all the required work / materials as per Drawing No 2H-C5-020_Rev T2 is already included.</p>
2	<p>Certificate of Compliance with OHSA 1993 and Construction Regulations 2003 (Certificate of Good Standing) does this include all partners or would it be acceptable if the Leading JV Lead Partner has the certificate, and will ISO 45001 be acceptable?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All partners of the JV as the regulations apply to all partners in the JV. There is no such a thing called Certificate of Good Standing, but a “Letter of Good Standing”. This is obtained from the Department of Labour giving assurance that the company complies or up to date with Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act (COIDA) requirements. • ISO 45001 – This is an ISO safety standard certificate and therefore has nothing to do with COIDA requirements.
